Did You Know That?

It turned out that it was not the printer at all, his copy of WordPerfect had been corrupted and the print request never made it to the print queue. You have probably noticed that when you are troubleshooting that the instructions say to try to print from Notepad or Wordpad. If I had done this, I would have found that it was the word processing software and not the printer. In this case the software was removed by using Control Panel's Add/Remove. Tips n' Tricks

Audioactive Stre/amPlay v1.3 [950k] W9x/2k FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 2-9-03

http://www.audioactive.com/download/dnl_ovw.html {Streaming player} From the Web site of your favorite radio station, you're listening to a great artist playing live in the studio. Suddenly... silence. Looking at your player, you see that little flashing red icon and the word "Rebuffering..." Don't you hate when that happens? Audioactive StreamPlay is a dedicated MP3 streaming player that's optimized for live audio streams and gets rid of those dead spots. The program comes with an onscreen data rate / buffer display. There was no mention of compatibility with Windows XP, but since it works with 2000 and NT, I would bet it would be OK for XPers - in this case. You'll also find some other free goodies on this site.

tinySpell v1.1 [543k] W9x/2k/XP FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 2-9-03

<http://www.mywebattack.com/gnomeapp.php?id=105898> tinySpell is a small spell-checking program, that automatically spell-checks a selected word that is copied to the clipboard. You can also set tinySpell to check your spelling on the fly while you are typing, and alert you by sound whenever it detects a misspelled word. The program runs in the system tray and suggests correct spellings via the right-click menu. Additional features include a private dictionary and an auto-replacement feature. Unique and compact... great for quick spell-checking, but limited to checking a single word at a time.

ZipphO v3.0.5 [2.8M] W9x/2k/XP FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 2-9-03

<http://www.zippho.net/index.php?goto=index&lang=en> ZipphO is a zip/unzip utility that provides support for most popular archive formats, including RAR, ZIP, CAB, ARJ, and several others. It comes with an attractive, easy-to-use interface and many advanced features, including support for directory structures within archives, archive testing, encryption, internal viewer, favorite folders and more. You can also use the program to create self-extracting .exe files, repair archives, and optionally extract multiple archives at once. Zippho also integrates into the Windows Explorer right-click menu for easy access. The program is nicely designed, well-featured, and easy to use, but appears to load significantly slower than most others.

MP3 Utilities v1.6.67 [2.8M] W9x/2k/XP FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 2-9-03

<http://www.emilianomartin.com.ar/MP3Organizer/Intro.asp> This is a package with six applications to manage MP3s. MP3 Organizer organizes your MP3s by title, artist, album, year, comment, genre, and path. MP3 Browser browses your music files and gets your groove on with one click. MP3 List creates text, Word, or Excel files with the MP3s you have and they can be synchronized with a Pocket PC device. MP3 Mover moves MP3s from the path where downloaded files are placed to the location to where all your MP3s are stored. Upgrade only impacts those who have used an earlier version of this collection. Last, Integrity Viewer is an application to see what problems occurred when trying to find the tags' information. Sounds like a "sound" package of MP3 utilities.

winLAME rc3 [583k] W9x/2k FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 2-9-03

<http://winlame.sourceforge.net/> {Audio encoder} winLAME is a small-size utility with the power to set up the encoding process for various audio formats with a wizard-style interface. It uses libraries like LAME, SSRC, OggVorbis, and MAD, plus it can encode and decode WAV, MP3, OGG, and AAC. The program helps novices make the right choices with their settings. If you have many files to encode, the program can batch process an unlimited number of files. The accompanied help file is thorough and should make it a snap for anyone to use the program. This program is anything BUT lame. The story is that "LAME" originally stood for "LAME Ain't an MP3 Encoder." When the last remnants of the ISO source codes were replaced, LAME became the source code for a fully LDPL (Library General Public License) MP3 encoder.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Vero Beach Main Library desperately needs volunteers to help with their computers, and we owe the Library **big-time** for letting us hold our SIGs and regular meeting there. The Library has two rather large sections of public-access computers with Internet access and Microsoft Office and a few computers with scanners and CD writers.

As a volunteer, you could help greatly by:

1. Signing patrons onto the computers, using a simple program called PC Reservation. Each patron must briefly visit the media desk helper (you) in order to be assigned a pin number to sign on to a specific computer. From then on the computer program keeps track of who is on what computer, how much time he or she has used it, which computers are still available, and you will be able to "see" that information.

2. Library Personnel are always around to aid the patron, plus it's very interesting and a lot of fun. Please, if you feel that this is something you can help out with, **even for only an hour or two a week or longer, contact me:**
