The new Windows Vista! I managed to hold off for 3 ½ days before I got Vista Home Premium. In my opinion, Vista is the most drastic change since Microsoft came out with Windows to replace DOS . At first I did NOT like it AT ALL! As a matter of fact, I didn't even turn the computer on for over a week after I first set it up. Determined to learn the system, I turned it on and found that there were Vista Demos available to view right on the computer. You can also view these demos by going to:

<http://windowshelp.microsoft.com/windows/en-us/demos.mspx> If you are planning to get Vista, it would probably be a good idea to view these before buying. The Demos are very good and even someone who has never used a computer could view these Demos and sit down and start using the computer. They are the best I have ever seen for a new operating system. Everything is covered right down to how you use the mouse. It has a new e-mail program replacing Outlook Express and there is a Demo on how to use the e-mail. I have been using a PC since 1989 and I even learned a thing or two. Now that I have viewed the Demo's I really do love the system.

If you are planning to get Vista, I would recommend getting the Home Premium rather than the Home Basic. I would also get at least 1 GB of memory, I got 2 GB on my computer, because I have been using 1 GB on my laptop and desktop for the last 3 years. I like lots of memory. When working with photos you need a lot. Some things may not work on Vista. My printer would not install using the install disk, but after going to HP I found that Vista has a driver that will work to print until the driver is ready. Vista wants you to use Office 2007 to open a .doc created in earlier versions of Word. I tried the Beta Version of Office 2007 and did not like it at all. If you have Office Documents and want to open them and continue to use them, Sun has come out with a new OpenOffice that will work on Vista and you can use it just like Microsoft Office without the expense of buying the new Microsoft Office 2007. With the new OpenOffice you can even send a document to PDF. WordPerfect 12 will also work on Vista and you can work in it as WordPerfect or Microsoft Office. So all is not lost with the old .doc files that you created using Word. OpenOffice is a free download and if you want a copy and do not have fast access, I will be glad to make a copy for you. Sun states that it is OK to make copies and give them to people. It is really a great Office Suite and it is free. If you go to Amazon you can get WordPerfect 12 Office for as little as \$30.00 or the new WordPerfect XP Office for under \$100.00. The Word that comes with Works looks like Word in earlier versions, but will not open a .doc file.

Some brands other than HP printers will not install at all. I had my wireless already connected so all I had to do was turn my computer on. With another customer, they got the D-Link and it installed first try. I could not get the LinkSys Wireless router to work for another Vista system and after a 45 minute wait on the phone with them was told that even with an experienced technician it may or may not work. An experienced tech did call back and that computer is now wireless also.

If you have questions, I will have Vista at my next SIG. By then I should be more familiar with it. I plan to try installing more software on the computer also. To date all I have is WordPerfect Office Suite and Adobe Elements 5 and Adobe Premiere. It sounds like the Movie Maker and all in the media center is going to work as well as Adobe for making slide shows. You can read PC World and Smart Computing, there is plenty written about.

Microsoft Vista - is it "The Wow Starts Now", or just ho-hum?

Well, who would have thought I would be one of the first on my block to own a computer with the new Windows Vista? Certainly not me! For those of you who know me, probably recall that I have been sticking with my old Windows 98 computer. Not that I am a diehard Windows 98 fan. Rather my philosophy generally is, if it ain't broke, don't fix it. Besides I hate to throw out anything that still works fine. And Windows 98 has always done everything that I needed it to do, although a little on the slow side.

Actually just a couple of months ago I rebuilt a computer that was given to me, with new RAM, a new hard drive and Windows 2000 which I happen to think is the best operating system that Microsoft has built so far. It had been working flawlessly and at much greater speed and efficiency up until a week or so ago, when one day it was completely dead! I tried everything I could think of to get it to come back to life, but I suspected a bad power supply, which required someone to test and verify for me. The test confirmed my suspicion, but Bob of PC Enterprises in Sebastian (who I would recommend) also discovered that the power supply failure apparently also shorted out the motherboard! So the cheapest and quickest solution to my problem was to buy a new computer.

So I thought I would let you know my experiences with Vista Home Basic so far. Well, the setup and transfer of my files and data to the new computer has not been a pleasant experience. Vista has a handy "Windows Easy Transfer" feature built in that will supposedly easily transfer all your settings and files for you. But it is designed to either transfer files from an older computer that is still functional, or a computer on which you are upgrading to Vista. It doesn't have any option for transferring files from a second hard drive which is installed in the same computer, which is usually the way I accomplish the process and in this case, about my only option. With both drives installed in the same computer, you can just copy and paste most files. With the new Vista email program - "Windows Mail", transferring email files from Outlook Express on my old computer was a huge frustration! The programs appear to be essentially the same, but after many hours of failure and no help from the Microsoft.com "Support" website, I finally found a solution by searching the Internet from someone else. If I had been smart, I would have started there first!

The other "glitch" that I ran into was that when I first got the new computer and was setting it up, it ran extremely slowly. The "cheap" desktop tower that I bought only has 512MB of RAM, which is about the minimum to run Vista, I have heard. But this was so slow, that I couldn't imagine Microsoft would have designed a system that ran so poorly and let it come to market like this!

My new computer is an eMachines and includes a trial version of the McAfee Security Center software. I happened to recall that a few years ago when I first subscribed to Comcast Internet service, they offered the McAfee Security Center software for free to its members. This is when I was still using Windows 98 and after installing it, my computer was so slow as to be virtually unusable! I removed all of the features of the software except the firewall, which is the only part that I really wanted and needed. This restored the operation of my computer to normal. So I gave this a try on my new computer and viola, Vista is working as I would have expected it to! I haven't spent a lot of time trying to solve what part of the McAfee Security Center software is clogging up the works and I'm surprised McAfee has not addressed the issue.

So at this point, after a couple of days of frustration and gnashing of teeth, Vista is working as I would have expected it to be out of the box. I have to say that it does look "pretty", but I still like Windows 2000 better. And with the luxury of time, I'm still considering rebuilding an older computer with Windows 2000 and ideally, a dual-boot with Linux. And by the way, I also have the "MySecurityVault" software that was demonstrated at one of general meetings this past year. It is a good password vault type program and it appears not to work at all with Vista. Hopefully they will be updating the program and will restore its function on Vista.

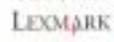
