## Pay Up or Die! Email extortion on the rise

A new wave of extortion e-mails that threaten recipients with bodily harm and death if they do not pay thousands of dollars to the sender is circulating on the Internet, according to security vendor SecureWorks Inc.

The messages are sent by scammers claiming to be assassins hired by third parties to harm the recipients. The sender offers to spare the recipient from harm in return for thousands of dollars.

Unlike many spam emails, these threats come from valid email accounts, instead of being masked by proxies and relays, so they seem more "genuine."

### Tip of the Week—The Immaculate Desktop

Are you the sort of neat-freak who abhors Desktop clutter? Who keeps all apps and docs in carefully organized folders? Consider diving deeper into onscreen clean by making your mounted drives and discs disappear from the Desktop and accessing them instead via Finder windows.

Here’s how to try it: From the Finder, pull down the Finder menu and select Preferences — or just press Command-comma [⌘,] from within the Finder. Click the General tab and uncheck Hard disks; CDs, DVDs, and iPods; and Connected servers.

Next, click the Sidebar tab and check the boxes next to all the items you unchecked under the General tab.

When you want to access a drive, disk, or server, just open a Finder window by pressing Command-n [⌘n] from within the Finder. And when you close the Finder windows, your desktop will be spotless. (Remember, Command-w [⌘w] closes a Finder window, and Command-Option-w [⌘⌥w] closes all Finder windows at once.

**Ultimate Boot CD v4.1** [115M] Windows FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 7-29-03

"I'm a bad girl. I don't have a special boot CD or diskette around here. There are too many options, and I never know what I need in a boot disk. This one sounds like the solution for a person in my situation because it fits as many diagnostic tools as possible onto the CD. It comes with a memory diagnostic tool and a few hard drive utilities. Those who DO have bootable floppies can dump them all for one nice CD package. All you do is boot up with the CD and it goes right to the menu, waiting for you to select the tool to use. Note: The Web site does not list specific OS compatibility information, although the program was tested successfully on Windows XP." [Meryl]

**MemTest v3.7** [15k] W9x/2k/XP FREE, Lockergnome Windows Digest, 7-29-03

No goats were harmed in the review of this program, as "RAM" - in this case - refers to memory, not animals. MemTest evaluates your computer's memory to store and retrieve data. If a computer can't do both tasks with 100% accuracy, then it is less stable and prone to crashing. Left untouched, it will get worse, and using MemTest will verify the RAM is functioning correctly. Before running the test, close all programs and allow the test to run for at least 20 minutes (overnight is optimum).

AceMoney Lite (personal finance manager) makes it easy to manage a checkbook, create and manage budgets, juggle finances in multiple currencies, track spending habits, record expenses, transfer among accounts, and even do on-line banking. The account information can be shared or password protected. The program offers an easy to use interface that is straightforward and much easier to use than most commercial packages, yet it offers everything you need to balance your personal bank account and keep track of where your money is going. The free version is limited to one bank account.

XP SysPad is like a Windows dashboard with a search box and calculator. Across the top of the dashboard are Net, Directories, System, Control Panel, Programs, Admin, and Favorites. The Net includes links to e-mail, searches, favorites, address books, IP information, network information, netstat, and IE cache deletion. Also, get quick access to main directories like My Documents, Recycle Bin, Program Files, and Windows folders. The Control Panel is available along with its sub-programs. The Programs lists installed programs, Task Manager, WordPad, NotePad, Windows Media Player, screen shot capture, and more. Instead of looking in two or three places for these main Windows utility programs, the dashboard gives you one-click access to most of these programs - about 85 functions. The useful utility uses a small memory footprint and doesn't touch the registry.

## Email—Message Without A Mouse

When you're typing away at a keyboard-intensive site such as Gmail or Yahoo! Mail, every trip to the mouse only slows you down. If you've ever used shortcuts, such as CTRL-S to save a word processor document or CTRL-P to print, you know that keyboard shortcuts can make working in frequently used applications much speedier. There's no need to go back-and-forth from keyboard to mouse for simple navigation if you take a bit of time to learn how your fingers can do the heavy lifting.

Gmail—Gmail has a fairly extensive set of keyboard shortcuts for quickly moving through your inbox. Learn some of the more important commands, and you'll be able to do all of your work in Gmail without ever touching the mouse. One of the nicest shortcuts when you're just starting out learning the keyboard ropes is the question mark (?), which brings up a list of all shortcuts for handy reference. Press any key to close the list and return to Gmail.

## Windows Vista—Make The Sidebar Work For You

“What the heck is that?”

One of the first things you may have noticed about Windows Vista was a broad stripe along the right edge of the screen. It faded in and out of view as you moved your mouse pointer over it. Moreover, it contained a column of what looked like big icons.

This is the Sidebar, which is one of Vista's more useful new features. It's a sort of dock for Gadgets, which do indeed resemble big icons. But whereas some icons on your Desktop launch applications and others act as shortcuts to file folders or documents, Gadgets play a somewhat different role.

Similar to doodads such as Apple's Widgets in Mac OS X and Stardock's DesktopX Widgets, Gadgets are simply small applications that hang out on your Desktop. They're graphical, very simple to use, and tightly focused on doing just one task.
