General Meeting, August 1, 2006 7:00 PM at the Vero Beach Main Library

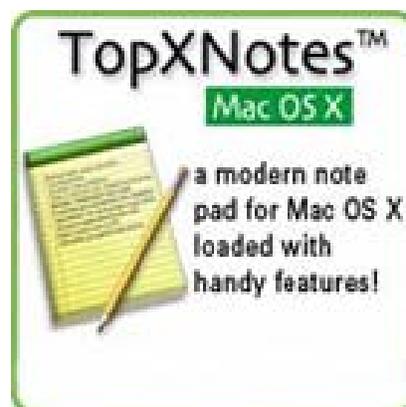

1. Signing patrons onto the computers, using a simple program called PC Reservation. Each patron must briefly visit the media desk helper (you) in order to be assigned a pin number to sign on to a specific computer. From then on the computer program keeps track of who is on what computer, how much time he or she has used it, which computers are still available, and, you will be able to "see" that information.
2. Library Personnel are always around to aid the patron, plus it's very interesting and a lot of fun. Weather Pulse is a weather-monitoring tool that displays detailed weather information for selected US cities, as well as popular satellite images from around the globe. It includes weather alert options, ten-day forecast, hourly forecast, detailed forecast, and more. The satellite images can be sent via e-mail and also saved to file. Weather Pulse integrates all the information into a simple, easy-to-use interface, and also provides a tray icon that displays the current temperature (we had to change the font settings for proper display). You can also add custom radar and weather images, view animated images, and monitor multiple ZIP codes. A nicely done program that puts local and global weather information into easy reach from the system tray.

He realized that other residents of Fellsmere weren't as fortunate as he and therefore started this organization to provide Christmas gifts to children of families who couldn't afford gifts at Christmastime. They expanded their services providing school supplies to the children and food to the families.

A few years ago, the facilities of what was a farmer's market across from the old Mesa Park on route 512 were donated to the organization.
